ACCESS TO SA UNIVERSITIES

SA Universities view:

- AS Levels = Matric
- A Levels = Between Matric and 1st year university

SA Universities require:

- NSC pupils to get a Bachelors Pass
- Cambridge pupils to get a Matric Exemption



ACQUIRING MATRIC EXEMPTION

	Subject	Level	Minimum Requirement
Group I (compulsory)	First Language English	AS Level OR IGCSE	D (45-55%) C (40-50%)
Group II (compulsory)	Second Language (Afrikaans)	IGCSE	C (40-50%)
Group III (compulsory)	Mathematics	A Level OR AS Level	E (25-35%) D (45-55%)
Group IV	Any other TWO subjects	A Level OR AS Level	E (25-35%) D (45-55%)

4 AS subjects and 1 IGCSE

OR

3 A Level subjects and 1 IGCSE

- You can complete the process in Grade 12 with AS results
- Most universities will assist with this in your first year of study



UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

 For most degrees, 4 AS subjects (3 of which are taken through to A Level) and 1 IGCSE subject will generate sufficient points to meet minimum entrance requirements

Exceptions:

- UCT Health Sciences Faculty/Faculty of Law (5 AS subjects and 1 IGCSE subject required)
- UCT Commerce (3 A Level subjects and 3 AS/IGCSE subjects)
- UK universities generally only consider 3 A Levels (exceptions require IGCSE e.g., Trinity College Dublin)
- European and USA universities vary, but generally 3 A Levels is sufficient
- Combinations of subjects required at AS and A Level will differ depending on the degree you wish to study



APPLYING TO STUDY THE CAMBRIDGE CURRICULUM

- 75% overall average excluding LO.
- 75% minimum in Mathematics.
- 75% in the electives they wish to take.
- We will use June Exams results to make initial selections



SUBJECT CHOICES

- To meet SA university requirements:
 - ✓ IGCSE Afrikaans (or any second language but NO IsiXhosa)
 - ✓ IGCSE English Language (option to take AS English Lang and Lit)
 - AS Mathematics
 - 3 Elective subjects at A Level

ENTERING THE CAMBRIDGE PROGRAMME

Grade 10:

- Term 3: Lessons for IGCSE Afrikaans/IGCSE English (continue with other NSC subjects as per usual)
- Term 4: Write IGCSE Afrikaans/IGCSE English (continue with other NSC subjects as per usual)

Grade 11:

Begin lessons for AS subjects

Is the Cambridge Curriculum better than NSC through the DBE?

Both NSC and Cambridge are highly regarded locally and overseas for university acceptance. Choice is student-dependent.

Do teachers have to have a certain qualification to teach Cambridge stream/have they completed compulsory training?

Many of our teachers have extensive Cambridge teaching experience. In addition, excellent further training is available.

Do you have a special venue for the pupils doing the Cambridge Stream to sit and do independent study?

Not necessary with our school having work rooms in each house



FAQ

When do they write examinations?

There are external examinations in June and October/November. We participate in the October/November series. Pupils can improve their Grade 11 AS results in June of Grade 12. We run internal prelims to provide examination practice.

What does it cost?

R25000pa over and above Bishops fees, excluding textbooks *June re-writes will be charged separately
