Supporting the process

- If a boy is struggling with a subject, or with a teacher, or in a class:
 - the first port of call is the **individual teacher**
 - if that is inappropriate or doesn't yield results, speak to the tutor
- If a boy is struggling generally approach his tutor or House Director
- If a boy seems to have a personality clash with a teacher it is best to approach that teacher first; otherwise ask the tutor for advice
- Encourage boys to self-advocate
 - boys and teachers are all people: sometimes disagreements occur
 - don't let boys fight fire with fire
 - be sure the boy is doing his part properly before reacting

Parents support for learning

- Please don't tell your son the worst of your school endeavours, tell them of your achievements and expect it from them.
- **Grit**, **curiosity** and **character** 3 things you can give your children that will change their lives.

• BE INVOLVED, but how?

- You are increasingly their role model
- Listen more
- Help reduce frustration and encourage perseverance
- Saturday night family games requiring a little strategy (Remember games go well with pizza.)

- Remember, teachers will try to make time with an individual boy to work through a difficulty.
